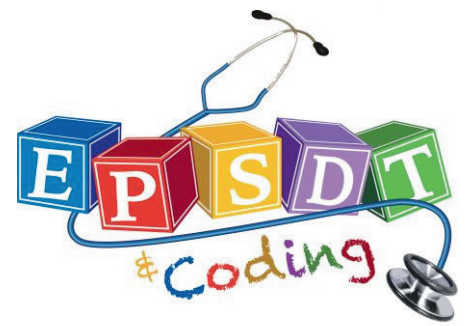

Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) and Coding Training

QI Project: MOC Part 4 Requirements

- Participate in the in-office EPSDT and Coding Training
- Attend Quality Improvement Training
- Develop practice QI team
- Use 'Model for Improvement' for a minimum of 3 PDSA cycles
- Review monthly reports for a minimum of 4 data cycles
- Engage with the QI team and stay informed of process improvement
- Submit Attestation Form to QI Coach to receive 25 points of MOC Part 4

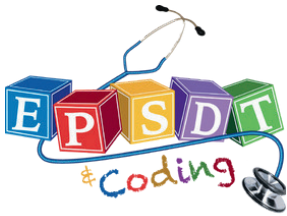

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Educational Programs offered by the Tennessee AAP



The **EPSDT and Coding Program** provides training to help improve the quality of preventive health screens and can assist with pediatric coding issues through various resources and services. The Tennessee Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics has partnered with BlueCare to develop the **Behavioral Healthcare in Pediatrics (BeHiP)** training program. BeHiP training provides pediatric healthcare providers with tools and strategies to screen for, assess, and manage patients with emotional, behavioral and substance abuse concerns. It also encompasses strategies to provide for more efficient workflow (including information on coding), more effective care, and improved family and physician relationships. Our two part training program has 13 different training modules that offer free CME. **BeHiP Tennessee Child & Adolescent Psychiatry Education & Support (TCAPES)** is a customizable and interactive program (with a focus on pharmacology) that will provide pediatric Primary Care Providers in Tennessee with training on screening and management of behavioral health conditions, assistance in finding community resources, and guidance on utilizing the TCAPES Psychiatry Consult Line. **BeHiP Foster Care Medical Home (FCMH)** program focuses on many of the topics mentioned above with a specific focus on children in foster care, with the goal of becoming a FCMH. START (Screening Tools And Referral Training) is a free educational program offered across the state. It was developed by TNAAP to help pediatric care providers- including pediatricians, family physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, and others - learn skills and strategies to implement routine developmental and behavioral screening using standardized screening tools. The training also includes the science behind screening, referral procedures, office workflow and coding for payment for screening that can easily be incorporated into the practice. Practice Management Quality Coaching provides guidance and coaching to help practices identify barriers to increasing EPSDT and Well Child rates. This may include potential process changes to improve workflow, connections to other TNAAP training programs and supports, quality improvement education and associated QI project opportunities, and facilitating communication with managed care organizations and community resources.
